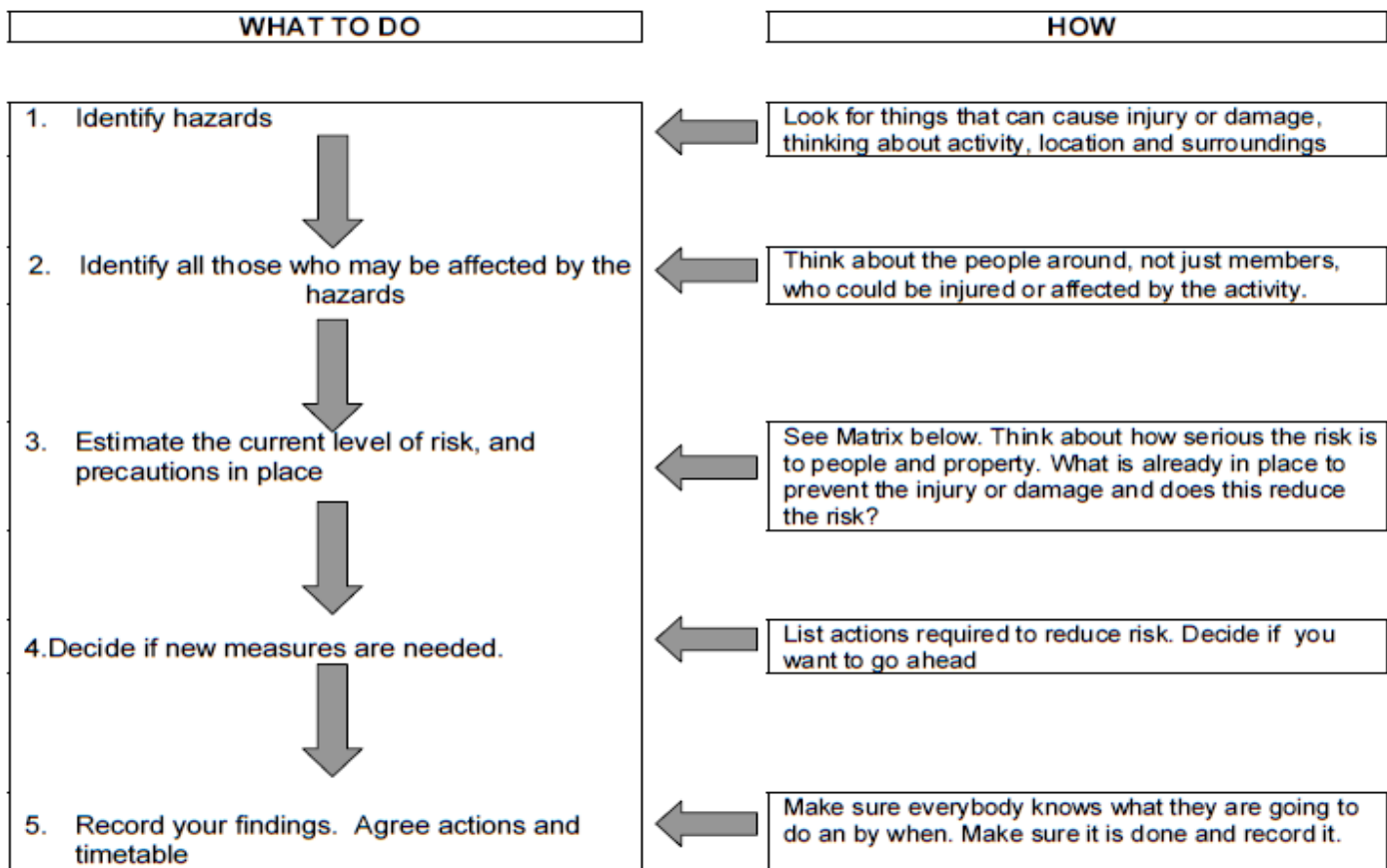

Out of control fires	All	<p>Check strength of wind prior to activity.</p> <p>Ensure a 'small' campfire is built and not a bonfire.</p> <p>A bucket of water to be available</p> <p>Have stock of wood for fire to be away from the main fire</p>	L	No		
Personal injury - eg burns/eye injury/splinters	All	<p>To take care when adding wood (risk of sparks or ash) or going near the fire. Wear appropriate footwear.</p> <p>Have first aid kit to hand - know what first aid action is needed</p> <p>Ensure all campfire blankets are kept away from the fire</p> <p>Ensure that only suitable wood is burnt</p> <p>Not allow sitting too close to the fire</p> <p>Use gloves when adding wood to avoid splinters</p> <p>If cooking - tie hair back, use oven gloves when lifting pans by metal handles</p> <p>Ensure adequate supervision of all participants</p>	L	No

	Severity	Slight Harm <small>superficial injuries, minor cuts and bruises</small>	Harmful <small>minor fractures, ill health leading to minor disability</small>	Extremely Harmful <small>multiple injuries, major fractures, fatalities</small>
